## South Pond Chapel Summer Hymn Sing

Summer hymn sings at the South Pond Chapel are sponsored by the First Baptist Church of Plymouth. The Chapel is located on Long Pond Road, off exit 5 in Plymouth. Each Sunday in July and August a different local minister leads the service, which begins at 7:00pm.

South Pond Chapel was built in 1870 as a Union Evangelical church for residents of the village at South Pond in Plymouth; it offered them a place to worship close to their homes what at that time was a remote part of town.

The Chapel has been a mission of the First Baptist Church of Plymouth for 51 years, offering a place for people of all denominations to gather to sing their favorite old-time hymns and gospel songs together, and to hear special music.

Last year, Peter was quoted saying "For 50 years I have had the high privilege of leading Old Home Day, and now it is time to bring that happy tenure to a close." Old Home Day (traditionally the last service of the summer) will now be led by the Reverend William Fillebrowne, who had family ties to the South Pond area.
